Vermont's Population is Growing Older

One in three Addison County residents are over the age of 60 (30% or 11,100 adults), making it the 10th oldest population in the state. Since 2001, Addison County has experienced a decreasing youth and an increasing older adult population. An increasing older adult population creates new challenges and emerging health risks.

Removing Barriers to Support Healthy Aging

Age Strong VT is working to make sure all Vermonters can age well. There are health differences between age decades in Addison County which should be considered

when planning institutional support for all older adults. Approximately one-third of adults 70 years and older live alone. Older adults who live alone are at higher risk for loneliness, injury from falls, and cognitive decline. Nine percent of 60-69-year-olds do not receive the social and emotional support they need. One-third of all older adults fell in the past year. Experiencing cognitive decline increases with age while not seeing a healthcare provider or drinking alcohol at a risk level decreases with age.
