Healthy Aging in Bennington County: An Overview of Adults 60+ Years Old



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Vermont's Population is Growing Older

One in three Bennington County residents are over the age of 60 (32% or 12,000 adults), making it the 5th oldest population in the state. Since 2001, Bennington County has experienced a decreasing youth and an increasing older adult population. An increasing older adult population creates new challenges and emerging health risks.

Removing Barriers to Support Healthy Aging

Age Strong VT is working to make sure all Vermonters can age well. There are health differences between age

decades in Bennington County which should be considered when planning institutional support for all older adults. The proportion of older adults living alone increases with age. Older adults who live alone are at higher risk for loneliness, injury from falls, and cognitive decline. Adults 80 years and older have a higher prevalence of not receiving the social and emotional support they need. Approximately one-fourth of all older adults fell in the past year. Experiencing cognitive decline increases with age while not seeing a healthcare provider or drinking alcohol at a risk level decreases with age.
